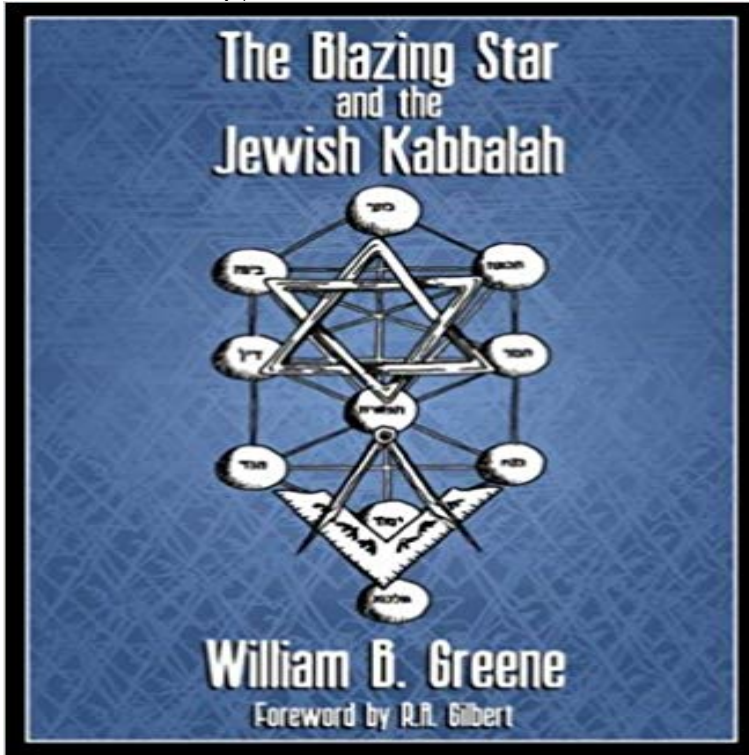


The Blazing Star and the Jewish Kabbalah
