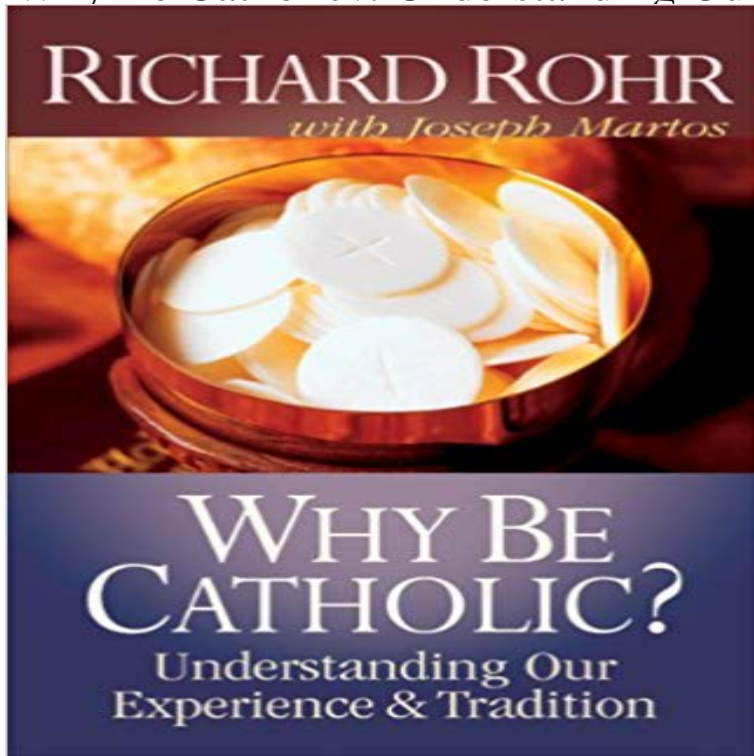


Why Be Catholic?: Understanding Our Experience and Tradition
