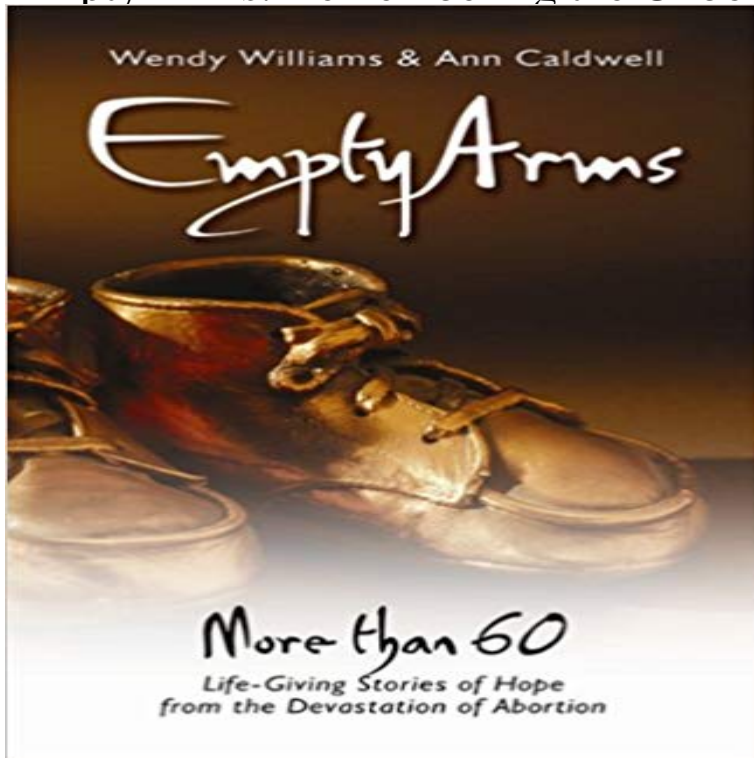


Empty Arms: Remembering the Unborn (Living Ink Books)
