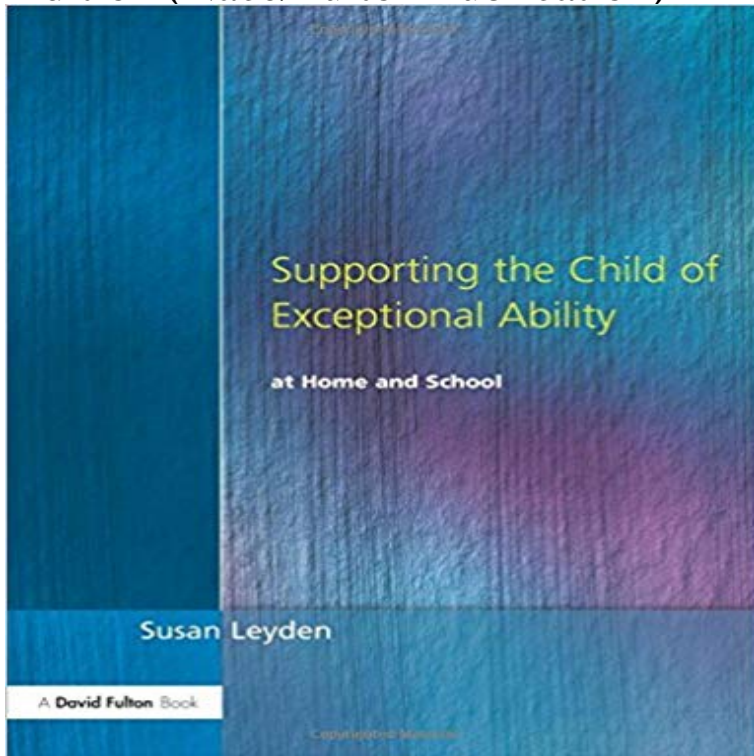


Supporting the Child of Exceptional Ability at Home and School, Third Edition (Nace/Fulton Publication)
