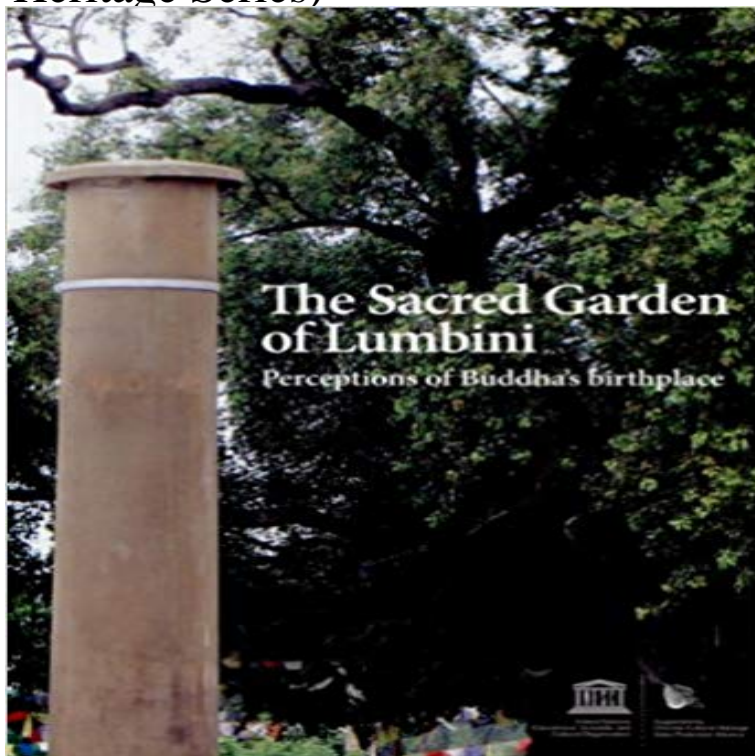


# Sacred Garden of Lumbini: Perceptions of Buddha's Birthplace (World Heritage Series)
